Celebrate the Past, Support Our Future!

Bonim, Builders—\$6000

Nine brick array of 8 inch x 8 inch bricks, creating a 2 foot by 2 foot square including the text of your choice.

Nedivim, The Generous—\$1800

12 inch x 12 inch brick with up to 8 lines of your chosen text, 30 spaces per line.

Tomchim, Supporters—\$360

Two bricks, 4 inch x 8 inch each, with up to 3 lines of text per brick, 20 spaces per line.

Amudim, Pillars—\$250

One 4 inch x 8 inch brick with up to 3 lines of text, 20 spaces per line.
